



THE FIVE COMPONENTS OF PROPOSITION 63, THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA) FACT SHEET

Proposition 63, passed by voters in 2004, is made up of 5 components:

- 1) Community Services and Supports (CSS)—provides funds for direct services to individuals with severe mental illness. Full Service Partnerships (FSP) are in this category; FSPs provide wrap-around services or “whatever it takes” services to consumers. Housing is also included in this category.
- 2) Capital Facilities and Technological Needs (CFTN)—provides funding for building projects and increasing technological capacity to improve mental illness service delivery.
- 3) Workforce, Education and Training (WET)—provides funding to improve and build the capacity of the mental health workforce.
- 4) Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI)—provides a historic investment of 20% of Proposition 63 funding to recognize early signs of mental illness and to improve early access to services and programs, including the reduction of stigma and discrimination.
- 5) Innovation (INN)—funds and evaluates new approaches that increase access to the unserved and/or underserved communities; promotes interagency collaboration and increases the quality of services.
